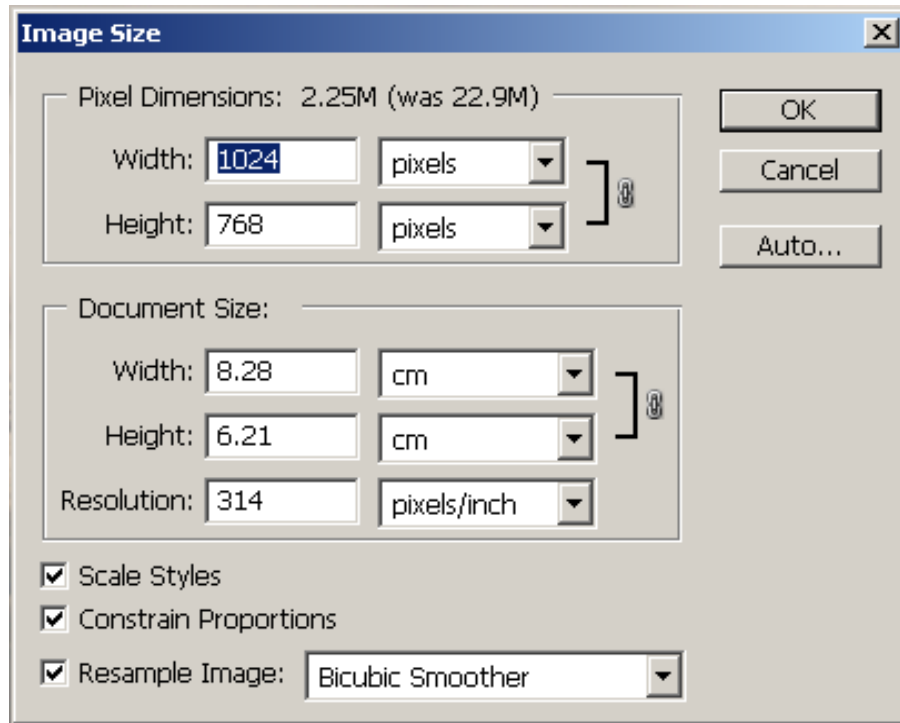


Resizing, titling & saving Digital Images in PhotoShop for Projected Images Competitions.

Digital images for the Projected Image Competitions will be judged in JPG format & at a resolution of 1024 pixels by 768 pixels, & against a black background. 1024 is the width across making it a landscape format. Firstly, you should re-size your image to fit within that pixel area. You will want to maintain the proportions of your image.

1. From the **Image** menu, chose **Image Size**, the **Image Size** dialog box is displayed below.



2. Make sure the units you have selected are **pixels** (top centre of the box).
3. Enter the width you want, for example 1024. The height will adjust automatically providing you have the **Constrain Proportions** box ticked.
4. Finally, check the height, if the height is more than 768 pixels, then you need to enter 768 in the height box, this will reduce the width to less than 1024 pixels. **Click OK.**

Note: Many people will talk about "file size" or "dpi" - none of this is relevant here. You are measuring in pixels only.

Adding a 2 pixel white keyline around your image after it has been re-sized. NB
This is optional.

Select > All. (this shows as marching ants around the perimeter of the image).

Edit > Stroke. Displays the Stroke dialog box, make sure it is set as follows...

Width - 2 px

Colour - white

Location - Inside

Blending Mode - Normal

Opacity - 100%

Click OK

Select > Deselect (to remove marching ants).
